On the x axis of the chart, we can see different provinces under their corresponding bar and on the y axis, we can see the dollar amounts. Each bar shows the corresponding BPA value for that province.

*Additional notes for Nova Scotia

Individuals in Nova Scotia with an income of \$25,000 or less can claim \$11,481, comprising the BPA of \$8,481 plus an additional amount of \$3,000. Individuals earning more than \$75,000 can claim \$8,481. Those earning between \$25,000 and \$75,000 can calculate a partial claim for the \$3,000 additional amount based on a sliding scale.
